On September 19, NTAA received word that Honorable Judge Charles Breyer signed his approval on the \$55 million settlement for Tribes to help fund and implement environmental mitigation projects in the coming decade. With Judge Breyer's approval the morning of September 19, 2017, the VW Settlement for Tribes moves to all the settlement parties for signatures. Once the attached agreement has all the signatures and is filed with the court, we will have a Trust Effective Date! This could happen this or next week. EPA Actions Announcements:

A pre-publication version of the final reconsideration for the Phosphate Fertilizer Production Plants and Phosphoric Acid Manufacturing Plants along with a summary fact sheet is posted at: <https://www.epa.gov/stationary-sources-air-pollution/phosphate-fertilizer-production-plants-and-phosphoric-acid>. The action clarifies the existing rule language and allows sources the time needed to design and install controls.

A final rule making minor technical amendments to a tool used to evaluate hydrogen chloride (HCl) continuous emissions monitoring systems (CEMs) – known as Procedure 6 also was signed. Procedure 6 specifies the minimum quality assurance requirements necessary for the control and assessment of the quality of CEMs HCl data used for compliance with regulatory requirements. Notice of Tribal Consultation for EPA's Draft FY18-22 Strategic Plan

EPA's Office of the Chief Financial Officer (OCFO) is currently conducting consultation and coordination with tribes on EPA's FY2018-2022 Strategic Plan. The Strategic Plan communicates the agency's priorities, the measurable environmental and human health outcomes the public can expect over the next four years, and the long-term blueprint for achieving those results. It also serves as the basis for agency-wide program planning and informs annual budget development and decision making. The plan covers important areas of interest that impact tribes.

The Plan is expected to be available for review in late September, with the consultation period ending on October 31, 2017. Need help designing your project? Join one of our Training & Technical Assistance (TTA) providers in your region at an ANA Project Planning and Development (PPD) Training. This in-person training takes place over several days and will walk you through a community-based planning process that will help to shape your project design.

PPD trainings are designed to provide prospective ANA applicants with skills to plan successful community development projects. Come to this training with an understanding of your community's long-range goals. Don't worry if you aren't quite there yet, we can also help you identify those goals along the way.

Participants learn how to:

- Work with community and key partners to identify and document specific problems that stand in the way of meeting community goals
- Create a project work plan to address those problems and attain community goals
- Develop measurable outcomes and impacts to the community
- Determine the level of resources and funding needed to implement the project

Training sessions are offered free of charge to tribes and Native American, Native Alaskan, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander non-profit organizations. Each participant is responsible for paying their own travel costs to attend. Unfunded ANA applicants are strongly encouraged to attend project planning and development training.

ITEP's Indoor Air Quality in Tribal Communities: A Level 1 course for Tribes in the Lower 48

September 26-28, 2017. Tulsa, Oklahoma

Course Description: This entry-level course is designed to provide an understanding of common indoor air quality (IAQ) problems in tribal homes and schools. The course includes an overview of indoor air pollutants and their health effects, and tips for solving IAQ problems. There will be hands-on practice with a comprehensive assessment checklist used to identify IAQ problems. This course

consists of lectures and a tribal case study, demonstrations, small-group activities, and a building walk-through.

Topics Include:

- Indoor air concerns in tribal communities
- Overview of building science
- Mold and its health effects
- IAQ pollutants and cancer
- IAQ and asthma
- Hazardous materials in homes and schools
- Combustion products
- Equipment for assessing IAQ
- Outreach: prevention of IAQ problems
- Collaboration and resources

There is no prerequisite for this course. Preference will be given to tribes who submit applications from TWO different departments: environmental, housing, and/or health. Preference will also be given to applicants who have an indoor air quality task in a grant work plan.
